- You didn't take out the trash, and now it smells bad.
- I messed up. I'll take it out right now.

- A. I lost my phone, and I need to call it. Could I borrow yours?
- B. Sure, here you go.
- A. Thank you! It's ringing, but no one is answering.
- B. Maybe someone found it. Let's check the coffee shop.
- A. Good idea. Thank you so much for helping me!
- B. No problem. Let's go.
