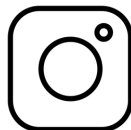

BRING: I have to bring my notebook to class.



BROUGHT: I brought my notebook to class yesterday.



BROUGHT: I've brought my notebook to class every day this week.



BUY: I like to buy fruit at the market.



BOUGHT: I bought fruit at the market this morning.



BOUGHT: I've bought fruit there many times this month.



FIGHT: They start to fight over the remote control for no reason.



FOUGHT: They fought over the remote again last night.



FOUGHT: They've already fought about the remote twice this week.



SEEK: The detective wants to seek the truth in this case.



SOUGHT: The detective sought the truth for many months.



SOUGHT: The detective has sought the truth tirelessly.





THINK: I try to think about my family when I'm away.



THOUGHT: I thought about them during my trip.



THOUGHT: I've thought about my family every day this week.



OVERTHINK: I tend to overthink before sending important messages.



OVERTHOUGHT: I overthought that message for hours yesterday.



OVERTHOUGHT: I've overthought similar messages many times.



CATCH: I always try to catch the ball during practice.



CAUGHT: I caught the ball with one hand yesterday.



CAUGHT: I've caught that ball many times before.



TEACH: I like to teach English to my sister at home.



TAUGHT: I taught her some new words yesterday.



TAUGHT: I've taught her English for a few weeks now.

LEND: I offered to lend my ladder to the neighbors.



LENT: I lent them the ladder yesterday afternoon.



LENT: I've lent that ladder to almost everyone on the block.



SEND: I plan to send the package this afternoon.



SENT: I sent the package with overnight delivery.



SENT: I've sent that same package twice by mistake.



SPEND: I don't like to spend too much money on clothes.



SPENT: I spent too much on a jacket last weekend.



SPENT: I've spent more on clothes than I expected this month.
